


Business and biodiversity loss

Threats to nature and the impact drivers / pressures underpinning them

Trends in corporate biodiversity measurement approaches

- Increasing demand for **credible reporting / disclosure** from **investors, policy makers and businesses**
- 2016 recommendations from the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) and IUCN World Conservation Congress:
 - > *Enhanced transparency and better reporting & disclosure*
- Significant progress made, with **broad landscape** of measurement approaches under development



Launch of Review Paper (2020) & Inf Doc (2021)


Reviews **drivers** and **current practice** around business measurement, reporting and disclosure

Provides recommendations for government policy makers to create a step change in business action to measure impacts and dependencies and performance:

- 1. Build business awareness of the value of biodiversity and how to measure impacts and dependencies**
- 2. Ensure a business-relevant post-2020 global biodiversity framework**
- 3. Require mandatory corporate biodiversity performance disclosure**

Converted into a formal Information Document for submission to the CBD for SBI-03 event in 2021

Contribution to BfN position on D01 of the framework

SUGGESTION 1 - A MISSION TO HALT AND REVERSE BIODIVERSITY LOSS BY

- **Science is clear:** we have 10 years to address the loss of biodiversity.
- **Political leadership** is crucial to accelerate this business action.
- **Long-term certainty and direction** for effective business planning.
- **The mission:** opportunity to set a target globally for all stakeholders to act.

Such a mission would:



SUGGESTION 1 - A MISSION TO HALT AND REVERSE BIODIVERSITY LOSS BY

Proposed amendment:

Section E. 2020 Vision and 2030 Mission

10. “To take urgent action across society to conserve and sustainably use biodiversity and ensure the fair and equitable of benefits from the use of genetics resources, **halt and reverse biodiversity loss** to put biodiversity on a path to recovery by 2030 to achieve a **nature-positive world** for the benefit of planet and people”.



Note: Business for Nature strongly welcome the proposed Goal C as we support a framework that ensures a fair and equitable benefit sharing. Biodiversity and its benefits currently has, in many cases, been shared inequitably. Businesses have a key role to play to take that into account. The suggestion to remove this reference in the mission is only to create a simple, clear mission but we support strong goals and targets on this essential objective of the CBD.

SUGGESTION 2 - DESIGN SMART TARGETS, ACTIONABLE BY BUSINESS ON NATURE LOSS DRIVERS

While Parties are responsible for the Framework's implementation, **businesses have the responsibility to co-lead the transformation needed.**

SUGGESTION 2 - DESIGN SMART TARGETS, ACTIONABLE BY BUSINESS ON NATURE LOSS DRIVERS

Proposed amendment:

Target 10. Ensure all areas under agriculture, aquaculture and forestry are managed sustainably, in particular through the conservation, **restoration**, and sustainable use of biodiversity, increasing the ~~productivity and resilience and when necessary, the productivity~~ of these production systems.

SUGGESTION 3 -

INTEGRATING NATURE INTO ALL DECISION MAKING

- We need to make decisions that go "**beyond short-term profit and GDP**"
- Targets 14-15-16 is a package to **embed the value of nature in decision-making** of Governments (T14), businesses (T15) and consumers (T16)
- Government must support and require businesses and financial institutions to **measure, disclose, and report** on their dependencies and impacts on biodiversity



SUGGESTION 3 -

INTEGRATING NATURE INTO ALL DECISION MAKING

Proposed amendment:

Target 15. Ensure that all businesses (public and private, large, medium and small) fully integrate biodiversity values into decision making, and regularly assess and report disclose on their dependencies and impacts on biodiversity, from local to global, and progressively reduce negative impacts by at least half and increase positive impacts to align all activities to a nature-positive economy, contributing to reducing biodiversity-related risks to businesses, and moving towards the full sustainability of extraction and production practices, sourcing and supply chains, and use and disposal.



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SUGGESTION 4 -

ENABLE BUSINESSES TO IMPLEMENT THE

FRAMEWORK

- The **SDGs** and the **Paris Agreement** have been able to identify business-relevant indicators
- Let's ensure we can track **business contributions** to the Framework



- Parties must adopt a strategic approach in mobilizing **business input at a national level**
- Targets and action plans for non-state actors

(new) **Developing and implementing national, regional and global targets and action plans for non-state actors, including all productive**

SUGGESTION 5 – ELIMINATE & REDIRECT ALL SUBSIDIES HARMFUL FOR BIODIVERSITY

→ We need to invest **\$700 billion per year** to reverse the global biodiversity crisis.

→ Estimated subsidies between **US\$5-7 trillion annually** given to the sectors of fossils fuels, agriculture, fisherie and water and sanitation



SUGGESTION 5 – ELIMINATE & REDIRECT ALL SUBSIDIES HARMFUL FOR BIODIVERSITY

Proposed amendment:

Target 18. ~~Redirect, repurpose, reform or Eliminate or reform~~ **subsidies and** incentives harmful for biodiversity, in a just and equitable way, **including by redirecting or repurposing** all of the most harmful subsidies by at least US\$ 500 billion per year, and ensure that all **direct and indirect** incentives, including public and private economic and regulatory incentives, **tax and public procurement policies**, are either positive or neutral for biodiversity.



SUGGESTION 6 – GREENING MAINSTREAM FINANCE

Proposed amendment:

Target 19. Increase financial resources from all sources to at least US\$ 200 billion per year, including new, additional and effective financial resources, increasing by at least US\$ 10 billion per year international financial flows to developing countries, **requiring financial institutions and businesses to integrate biodiversity values into all financial decisions**, leveraging private finance, and increasing domestic resource mobilization, taking into account national biodiversity finance planning, and strengthen capacity-building and technology transfer and scientific cooperation, to meet the needs for implementation, commensurate with the ambition of the goals and targets of the framework.



SUGGESTION 7 - A ROBUST MONITORING, REPORTING AND REVIEWING MECHANISM

Strongly concerned that the elements related to the implementation mechanism have been removed from the draft



A strong implementation mechanism is essential for businesses to ensure a level playing field globally

SUGGESTION 7 - A ROBUST MONITORING, REPORTING AND REVIEWING MECHANISM

Proposed amendment:

J. Responsibility and transparency

NEW xx. These mechanisms must be effective, comprehensive and cyclical and include the three following components:

- a) by xx, translate this framework and its targets into relevant national and regional planning processes, including strengthened NBSAPs;**
- b) by xx, review the progress made in implementing this framework;**
- c) by xx, ramp up the delivery of plans and actions at the national and regional level.**
- d) This four-year cycle will repeat itself, with another review of progress by 2028 and another ramping up of plans and actions by 2030**

SUGGESTION 8 – AN INTEGRATED APPROACH TO THE CBD AND UNFCCC

Proposed amendment:

Target 8. Minimize the impact of climate change on biodiversity, contribute to mitigation and adaptation through **high-quality, inclusive and rights-based nature-based solutions and** ecosystem-based approaches, contributing at least 10 GtCO₂e per year to global mitigation efforts, and ensure that all mitigation and adaptation efforts avoid negative **have positive social and environmental impacts.**
